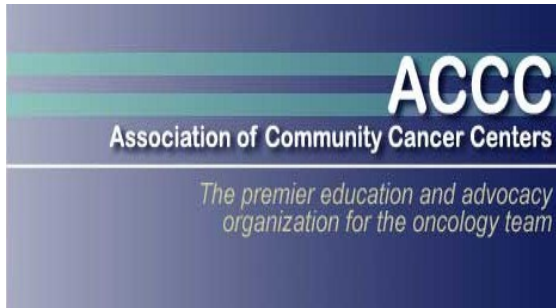


Celebrate Life: Sharing the Grief, Sharing the Living

The Laughlin Cancer Care Program is launching its first ever newsletter with the goal of providing cancer patients with the necessary education and resources needed during and after a cancer diagnosis. We want patients to be educated about their cancer treatment and urge them to make their health and well being a priority while having treatment and after treatment.



The Laughlin Cancer Care Program has been an accredited cancer program through the American College of Surgeons Commission on Cancer (CoC) since 2009, with 3 year re-accreditation awarded in 2012. We are also a member of the Association of Community Cancer Centers (ACCC) and maintain a collaboration agreement with the American Cancer Society. The Laughlin Cancer Care Program is one of approximately 1400 CoC-accredited cancer programs in the US and Puerto Rico, which represents close to 25 percent of all hospitals. This 25 percent of hospitals diagnoses and/or treats 80 percent of newly diagnosed cancer patients each year. A full scope of services including diagnostic and treatment services such as radiation therapy, chemotherapy, and surgery are available. The Laughlin Center for Women's Health is "An Accredited Breast Imaging Center of Excellence" with accreditations that include mammography, breast ultrasound, general ultrasound, and stereotactic breast biopsy. There are numerous early detection and prevention programs provided to the Greeneville/Greene County community. Breast cancer prevention/early detection programs include the "Yes, Mam"

Program, which is a three-step program designed to promote healthy breast care and aid in early detection of breast cancer. A grant from the Tri-Cities Affiliate of Susan G. Komen for the Cure provides funds for a special program entitled, "Tell Your Mom, Save a Life" as well as provides 200 free screening mammograms for women who qualify. Laughlin participates in various programs and health fairs in the community bringing awareness to colorectal, breast, lung, skin, and prostate cancer.



The Colossal Colon visited Greeneville on Wednesday, April 10, 2013 at the Greene Technology Center. The community was challenged to "crawl the colon" featuring the original "Colossal Colon" and learn that colorectal cancer can happen to anyone at any age. The Colossal Colon is a 40 foot, 4 foot tall crawl through replica of a human colon demonstrating healthy tissue, various diseases of the colon, polyps, and various stages of colorectal cancer. This program was free and open to the public. Cancer screenings are also offered to the community. Dr. Susan Abernathy conducted a free oral cancer screening on April 19, 2013 in conjunction with Head and Neck Cancer Awareness month at Greeneville ENT Associates.

Look Good . . . Feel Better

The Look Good...Feel Better program is for women undergoing radiation and chemotherapy. Spend an afternoon with certified professional cosmetologists as they demonstrate skin, nail and hair tips that can enhance your appearance and improve your self-image while undergoing cancer treatment. It is a free program hosted by the Laughlin Center for Women's Health and is in Partnership with ACS, NCA, and CTFAT. Complimentary cosmetics and skin care products are provided.
